Poisoning Response Readiness		
1.	Learn to recognize symptoms of poisoning that are common to the pesticide you are using.	
2.	Do not hesitate to get medical attention if symptoms of poisoning appear after handling, mixing and applying pesticides. Time is important.	
3.	Read the product label. Labels give directions about what to do or not do in the case of poisoning.	
4.	Keep important phone numbers handy: doctor, hospital, poison control centre so you can get help quickly.	
5.	Learn First Aid. If you work with pesticides, then you need to know how to administer First Aid properly.	
6.	Know how to deal with the four kinds of exposure. Become familiar with different first aid techniques needed to deal with the four: inhalation, ingestion, skin and eye exposure.	
7.	Put on protective equipment before you respond to someone who has become ill or is unconscious. There may be pesticide on or around the person.	
8.	Always have a good supply of water and an eye wash bottle handy. It may be needed to wash off the pesticide.	
9.	The doctor will need to know the kind of pesticide that was used in order to treat the person. Take the label to the doctor.	
10.	Stay calm! The person who becomes poisoned needs your help. If you become poisoned, call for help and wait for assistance, or go directly to a hospital if possible.
